

A new paper selection process

(proposal)

- Select papers on absolute merit rather than ranking
- * "Is fit for CSL" rather than "top 35 submissions"
- * used by many conferences including LICS & POPL
- * recommendation by steering committee sought following email discussion

Issues to consider

- * Can quality of papers be preserved?
 - Can such an "absolute" quality judgement be made?
 - * Are relative rankings essential?
- * Do we want a larger CSL?
 - * Which one is more viable and attractive: smaller or larger CSL?

FAQ (from email discussions)

- * Will CSL become a workshop by doing this?
 - * No, top conferences such as LICS & POPL use it and are happy.
- * Will the conference lose prestige because of this?
 - * Did LICS & POPL lose prestige in the last few years?
- * Will CSL have parallel tracks?
 - * Maybe, depending on how many papers accepted. It could be just one or two half-day sessions.
- * Does this mean "tiered" acceptance? (e.g. presentation without publication)
 - * No.
