## Use of public funds for electioneering

I wish to protest at the Department of Health's action in rolling out the Summary Care Record in a number of regions including London.

This system is politically controversial. Labour is committed to introducing it despite scant evidence that such systems do any good; the Conservatives and Lib Dems are thinking of killing it on privacy and cost-effectiveness grounds. The BMA takes the view that it should be opt-in rather than opt-out. So public money is being used to leaflet all London homes, in the run-up to an election, on an issue that is likely to be part of the pre-election public debate.

Would you please review as a matter of urgency whether this is an appropriate use of public money?

My interest in the matter is (a) as a taxpayer (b) as the lead author of the 'Database State' report published last March by the Joseph Rowntree Reform Trust, which highlighted ECHR concerns with a number of central systems including the SCR (c) as the chair of the Foundation for Information Policy Research.
