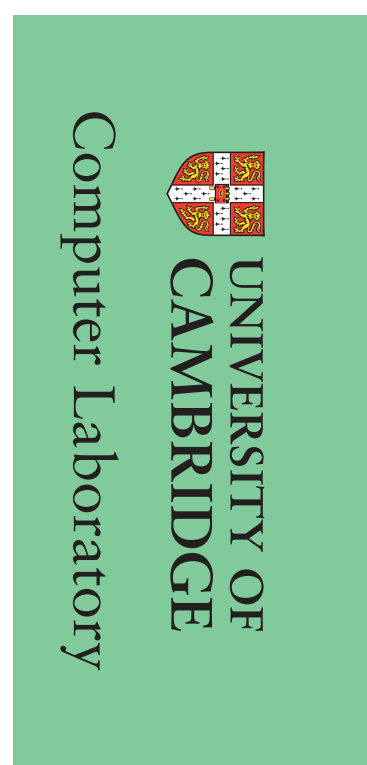

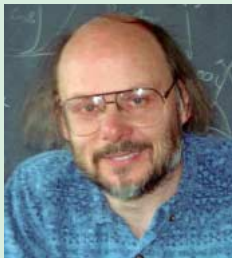

I'm now the College of Engineering Professor in Computer Science at Texas A&M University."



Research students cost, in fees and living expenses, about £25,000 a year. With half a million pounds capital, we can provide full support for one student, or material support for three, in perpetuity.

We currently have 100 doctoral students in residence. External funding for students is often uncertain or tied to particular purposes. We want to be able to fund students ourselves so they can work with the freedom that leads to advances in the field.

Our aim is £15 million

We have raised £1.5 million already

With this start we will be admitting at least two Fund students now, to start work in October 2007.

Our current students are working across the whole range of computer science, engineering and technology, for example on *The Intelligent Book*; *Sentient computing*; *Contract-driven e-business*; *Programmable logic security*.

Help us to fund more of the doctoral students who will keep our research at the leading edge of computer science and technology.
