My daughter, Germaine, noted that organisations like MIT are very active in Thailand and wondered why leading British universities are not as engaged. She suggested that UoC might consider running a Computing/STEM challenge, which could be promoted by the British Council (with whom she works closely) as part of the 170th-anniversary celebrations. In this local news article about the anniversary events you will see reference to particularly targeting students. Germaine mentioned that it would be relatively easy for her to find suitable Thai organisations to partner with around delivery if needed and that the initiative could come at little or no cost to the university. Just lots of free publicity!

The Embassy and the British Council are keen to promote British business, including higher education, so they would likely welcome such an initiative.
