The committee discussed how the restructuring of the Tripos could be achieved through the formation of subject-area consultation groups, according to NAD's proposal (TC0708/05). It was agreed that five subject-area groups should be formed: Hardware & Systems; Professionalism; Theory; Applications; and Programming. Key people should be appointed to head each group.

The committee agreed that Part IB should contain core material with a maximum of 240 lectures. As such, there is a need to reduce the amount of material taught in certain IB courses.

It was agreed that the way in which programming in taught in Part IA needs to be reworked. It was suggested that Larry Paulson would be a good candidate to take charge of re-organising Paper 1. NAD was actioned to find a UTO to co-ordinate the new course(s) that will be needed. The committee noted that this means that the Programming in Java course, which is currently taught by Arthur Norman, will not be used in future.

It was agreed that for each Part IA & IB course, the committee should endeavour to identify at least two UTOs who can lecture it. This would be very useful for covering teaching when staff take Sabbatical Leave.
