1. Apologies for absence

MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

2. Approval of minutes of the previous meeting

The minutes were signed and agreed.

3. Any matters arising from the previous minutes

3a. Item 6a ii, 3 November 2009. Review of Part II, Exam Attempts

The Teaching Committee extended their thanks to CHN for creating the table of exam attempts. It was suggested that the examiners should send an email to remind lecturers to have their exam questions peer-reviewed. It was noted that the Chairman would make this request.

It was agreed that the committee would consider asking Robert Watson, a current PhD student, to lecture this course when he has completed his PhD.

3c. Item 6a iv, 3 November 2009. Review of Part II, Additional Topics

The title "Topical Issues in Computer Science" was suggested as an alternative title; it was agreed that RKH would discuss this title with AH.

3d. Item 6a v, 3 November 2009. Review of Part II, NLP Lectures

It was agreed that NLP could increase from eight to 12 lectures as requested if space can be allocated during the timetabling process.

3e. Item 6a viii, 3 November 2009. Review of Part II, Projects

The Teaching Committee prefer to request that examiners viva 10-15 percent of the Part II students. It was agreed that the Chairman would talk to the Chief Examiner in regards to the suggestion that the viva examinations could begin this academic year.

The Teaching Committee are in favour of requesting supervisors to sign a document that states that the project is real and had been completed as described in the dissertation.

6a. Review of Part II
