- (3) Raymond pitied the man who John brutually kicked.
- (4) John gave Mary and provided Raymond with some books.
- (5) Which book did Mary provide Raymond with?
- **2.** Try the following sentence in the C&C parser online demo. To which words does the parser assign the incorrect category? *Briefly* give some possible reasons for the parser's mistakes.

 $\label{lem:chairman} \textit{John Raymond} \;, \textit{former chairman of Consolidated Gold Fields PLC} \;, \textit{was named a Chief of this British industrial conglomerate} \;.$

3. The verb *swing* is seen a number of times in the Penn Treebank, but never as a transitive verb. Hence the C&C parser analysis of *He swings the golf club* is incorrect (try it on the online demo). Give some *brief* suggestions for how you might try and improve this aspect of the parser's performance.
